REFLECTIONS FROM THE PEW BY DAN SITZMAN

One of my roles in my "real job" as an instructional coach is to be available for new science teachers to guide them through issues throughout their first year in the school district. A month into the school year. I have met with several who are struggling to withstand the headwinds of many things, from classroom management, finding equipment and materials, lesson planning. assessment, grading, and time management both professionally and personally. Sometimes I need to be direct and say "here is how you get to the electronic folder that has the pacing guide for the course" or "you don't need to point out every spelling error and misplaced punctuation on every assignment for every student." Most of the time. I listen for the teacher's own ideas and philosophy and focus on one aspect that can be tweaked or flipped. Oftentimes, after reflection and a dialogue between the teacher and me, it is a simple solution that addresses the teacher's situation or provides prospective.

In this week's lesson passage from James we hear, "If we put bits into the mouths of horses to make them obey us, we guide their whole bodies. Or look at ships: though they are so large that it takes strong winds to drive them, yet they are guided by a very small rudder wherever the will of the pilot directs."

Changing habits, considering different perspectives or accomplishing many tasks on our "to do" list can seem overwhelming. But small shifts can change one's direction without requiring massive, well trained animals or strong winds. With faith, hope and love, each of us can make a big difference.
