REFLECTIONS FROM THE PEW BY DAN SITZMAN

When I was about 11 years old, my grandparents came to town to get some shopping done. I cannot recall why they were hauling around 3 grandchildren aged 8 to 11 on a hot day to run errands. After traveling from one location to another, we were treated to a visit to a Dairy Keen and told to step up and order what we wanted. I remember watching the surprised look on my grandfather's face when my younger sister Annie ordered the largest milkshake, the most expensive item on the menu. When the story got back to my parents, my sister justified her request by saying, "Grandpa got change back!"

Whether it is a trip to the grocery store or major retailer or an on-line shopping experience, there always seems to be an incentive to buy just a little more, whether it is a "Buy 5 to save \$5," "BOGO," "Super-size," or "Free Shipping with \$99 purchase." In some cases, it makes financial sense, especially if we are going to use the item soon. I will never have (or want) the opportunity to find relevant legal and tax advice at www.superyachtinvestor.com. But what does it take for me to be content with my financial and material possession situation? What decisions do I make to demonstrate the humility and modesty of Jesus, even if I get change back?
