BIOGRAPHIES FOR OUR 2019 VESTRY NOMINEES

Josh Conrad biography:

I graduated one year ago from college on my 23rd birthday. I am employed as an engineer for the postal service in the Omaha area and have returned to the church where I grew up. I first attended St. Andrew's in 2001 and continued attending St. Andrew's through high school. In high school, I stayed busy with band, cross-country, and track. Those activities shaped me by teaching me how sustained effort with goals in mind can get you where you want to be. While in college, I attended St. John's by the Campus in Ames and participated in the church choir as well as the college-aged group. College was really a great experience for me. I was exposed to many different types of people with both similar and different perspectives. Learning about different people gave me more depth to my faith as well as new questions. REFLECTIONS FROM THE PEW BY DAN SITZMAN

W. Kamau Bell, a television host and stand-up comedian known for his humorous, yet candid observations on society, notes that it is not what happens in the moment or what is next, but what is “next after next.” Bell says, “Martin Luther King, Jr. did not after the March on Washington say ‘Well, I’m glad that is over and we no longer have racism.’ He was already working on addressing racism’s effect on poverty and the Vietnam War.”
