From the Rector:

Dear St. Andrew's parish:

A warm Happy New Year to all! As we move past the Christmas season and into the season of Epiphany, I am reminded that the word "Epiphany" means to have a revelation. During September of 2019, as a parish, we engaged in an inventory survey to assess where we identify as a whole on a wide variety of subjects. A committee was appointed to look at the results, which were anonymous. The results of what the committee felt were most important to emphasize can be found here in their summary report which was presented to the vestry at its most recent December meeting. This is our "revelation" as we move forward.

REPORT OF RENEWAL WORKS COMMITTEE

During the latter half of 2019, St. Andrew's Episcopal Church commissioned a study of the vitality of the Church based on a Renewal Works program created by the general Episcopal Church. Members of St. Andrew's were asked to complete a detailed questionnaire regarding their religious values and practices as well as their feelings about St. Andrew's Church itself. The clergy of St. Andrew's assembled a diverse group of individuals from the Church to form a committee utilizing the tools of the Renewal Works program (including Episcopal Beliefs and Practices, Best Practice Principles of Spiritually Vital Churches, a demographic analysis of Douglas County, and a summary of the responses to the questionnaires completed by Church Members) to analyze the survey results. After a series of four meetings, the Committee reached the conclusions and produced the recommendations in this report.

DEMOGRAPHICS

A survey was commissioned by the leadership of the church in {September} of 2019 to get a demographic and spiritual profile of the Church as a whole. Out of an average attendance of 171 Parishioners, including children, we received a sample of 92 responses, a rate of ~56%.

The Parish demographics mirror the statistics of the national church indicating our average weekly attendance is down by 25% in the last 10 years. Our Parish is not diverse in terms of race or culture; our members mostly live outside of a 3 mile radius of the church; and most parishioners have been long time members of the church.

Even though the community surrounding St. Andrew's is stable, our church attendance has declined significantly.

SUMMARY OF THE SPIRITUAL PROFILE OF ST. ANDREW'S

The data collected on the Parish shows our membership:

- has a persistent hunger for spiritual growth that is not being met
- has an interest in spiritual movement
- is not complacent about their faith and church

- is seeking to go deeper into their spiritual journey; however,
(I) they feel they do not have the tools
(II) they don't feel challenged in this area

The data shows that bold, church-wide initiatives would be welcomed by the membership. This could include deeper engagement and understanding of the Eucharist and core Christian beliefs, encouragement of public & private morning and evening prayer, and encouragement of independent reading of the Holy Bible. Overall a focus on scripture and prayer in all Church activities is needed.

SUGGESTIONS FOR BEST PRACTICES FOR ST. ANDREW'S

The Renewal Works process reflected a very large diversity of churches from which certain themes emerged that have been identified as best practice principles. These churches excel at helping their congregation grow in their Love of God and Love of Others. Our committee has discovered the following that could apply to St. Andrew's in our continuing growth and development:

- better understanding and teaching of Episcopal beliefs
- helping parishioners develop skills/strengths
- encouraging daily devotions & private reflection/prayer
(I) Encourage utilization of Forward Day by Day
- including scripture and prayer at every meeting
(I) Suggest St. Andrew's Prayer
- encouraging service by all
(I) Utilize each person's gifts
- building connections with the community outside the church

KEY TAKEAWAYS OF THE RENEWAL WORKS COMMITTEE

Our profile shows that we are high in works in the church, but low in beliefs. Data shows a lack of belief in the authority of Scripture, with 50% or less believing in core Christian beliefs. Our strengths include praying for others and prayers for repentance which are both higher than the norm. Our current activities show that our members score high in serving the church in various capacities.

This report gives us very blunt facts about our Christian life, reinforces the best defining features of our Parish, and provides a guide for ways in which to grow in our Faith in Christ and Love of Others.

Father John's comments: It can be difficult to distill a large amount of data into something understandable. This report is a brief overview of lots of data. Some of my key takeaways were this: We are like most Episcopal churches in many ways. The raw data showed the results from our church as compared to the Episcopal Church in general. We are fairly typical in most ways that were measured. We also didn't have a lot of areas that needed special attention. We just need to focus more on good best practices that will help us all grow spiritually. It is my goal, as rector, to implement to the best of our ability, the best practices you see listed above. Some of them we have already implemented, such as prayer and bible study before any church meeting by any group. We are also making a more intentional emphasis on scripture, its use and its meaning, as we clergy prepare our sermons. The data we collected was useful and will help guide us as we move forward into 2020. You'll see other changes as we move into the New Year. May we all be willing to engage, in whatever level we are at, to move forward in our own spiritual life and commitment to Jesus. Father John+

TUESDAY MORNING BIBLE STUDY

Tuesday morning Bible study will begin on Tuesday, January 14, 2020 at 10am. We will be delving into Paul's letter to the Romans. Everyone is welcome...bring your favorite bible translation.

Paul's main purposes in writing his church epistles are to (1) instruct churches about the central tenets of Christianity and (2) encourage Christians to live righteously in a world that doesn't share their values or beliefs.

The central thesis of Romans is quite straightforward. Paul summarizes it near the beginning of his letter:

"For I am not ashamed of the gospel for it is the power of God for salvation to everyone who believes – first to the Jews and then to the Gentiles." (Romans 1:16)

CGS FORMATION TRAINING STARTING

The Christian Formation for our children ages 3-9 is the Catechesis of the Good Shepherd. This Montessori based program is centered in scripture and liturgy and gives our youngest children the opportunity to develop their relationship with Jesus and to more fully participate in the liturgy. Adults who work with the children have their own formation experience and deepen their own relationship with God. St. Andrew's is offering another opportunity for adults to learn about the child, to be better parents, grandparents, and Christian leaders at St. Andrew's.

Starting in January, a Level I formation course will be held at St. Andrew's every Monday evening from 6:00 – 8:30 pm. This course will cover liturgy and scripture, Montessori theory, and many other topics.

Course Objectives:

- To explore with participants the general developmental and religious characteristics of the 3-6 year old child.
- To facilitate meditation upon the biblical and liturgical themes of the Catechesis.
- To offer guidelines and assistance to catechists in setting up an atrium for 3-6 year olds, preparing an album, and making materials.
- To deepen participants' ability to observe and learn from children, while also exploring avenues for deepening parental and congregational ability to observe and learn from children.

If you are interested in working with the young children of St. Andrew's, or just want to know more about CGS and children, please consider joining this course. We hope to include people from other area Episcopal and Roman Catholic churches.

Important information for anyone that uses the downstairs dishwasher.

DOWNSTAIRS DISHWASHER START-UP INSTRUCTIONS

1. Take out scrap screen and scrap basket. Check bottom of wash tank for foreign objects. Then clean and put back scrap screen and scrap basket.
2. Be sure drain lever is in closed (down) position (close if necessary) and then close dishwasher doors.
3. Turn on power box on wall by pulling lever, then switch on booster heater on floor to right of dishwasher by flipping toggle switch, and finally, push button on dishwasher control box that is just below dishwasher. The dishwasher is now powered and ready to run.
4. Open dishwasher doors and then close them. The machine will start to fill with water. The control box screen will read "FILL".
5. When machine is filled with water, the control box screen will show the temperature of the wash tank water.
6. The machine is ready to wash when the temperature reaches 150 degrees or higher. This will take about 20 minutes.
7. Pre-rinse a rack of dishes with the hanging sprayer, open the dishwasher doors, and slide in the dish rack.
8. Close the dishwasher doors. The machine will carry out a wash and rinse cycle automatically. Wash cycle has soap and rinse cycle has rinse solution.
9. The machine will wash for 40 seconds (temperature must be 150 degrees or greater). The machine will then rinse for 9 seconds (temperature must be 180 degrees or greater).
10. Open doors and move rack of clean dishes to left and repeat with new rack of dishes. Rack and dishes will be hot.

DISHWASHER TURN-OFF INSTRUCTIONS

1. When finished washing dishes, drain the water from dishwasher by pulling up the lever on the right side of the tank. **NOTE: IT IS VERY IMPORTANT TO DRAIN THE MACHINE WHILE IT IS STILL TURNED ON.**
2. Turn off dishwasher control box by pushing the black button. The screen will go blank.
3. Turn off booster heater by flipping the toggle switch.
4. Turn off main power using the lever on the grey power box on wall.
5. Using hanging sprayer, wash out inside of machine.
6. Lift out scrap basket and scrap screen, and remove all food material. Check and remove any objects from bottom of machine. Replace scrap screen and scrap basket.
7. Close drain by pushing drain lever down. It is OK to leave doors open so machine can dry out.
8. Machine is now ready for the next user.

Extra Information

1. Be sure that there is a container to catch water in case the booster heater drains during the start up process. This occurs occasionally. The booster drainpipe is near the floor to the left of the booster heater. If it does drain, empty the container so it will not overflow if the booster heater drains again (a very rare event). Careful, the water could be hot.
2. During the startup process, it is OK to open and close the washer doors occasionally to confirm the washer is going through the wash and rinse cycles correctly. However, do not wash dishes until the wash water temperature is 150 degrees or greater, and the rinse water temperature is 180 degrees or greater.
3. Feel free to set up a time with me to go over how to use the machine prior to your event. I will meet with you and together we can turn on the machine, wash some dishes, and turn it off.
4. If questions occur when you are using the machine at your event, contact me for help.

FRICKE EPISCOPAL FOOD MINISTRY ANNOUNCES ITS NEW NAME

The food-providing effort of seven Omaha-area Episcopal churches has changed its name to the Fricke Episcopal Food Ministry to better describe its current activities.

Previously known as the Dean Fricke Memorial Episcopal Food Pantry, the organization stopped handling food in early 2019. That was when the Food Bank of the Heartland ruled that, after some 30 years of operation, the group could no longer pack grocery bags for other agencies to distribute to the needy.

In response, the Fricke board of directors refocused its efforts on providing money, through Food Security Grants, to agencies that carry out its mission of serving others in the name of the Lord by providing food to families and individuals in need. The name honors the Very Rev. Jack Fricke, Dean of Trinity Episcopal Cathedral in Omaha, who died in 1990.

The Fricke Episcopal Food Ministry continues to solicit donations to support the grants, and its original name, the Dean Fricke Memorial Episcopal Food Pantry, continues to be registered as a tax-exempt 501(c)(3) organization. Checks may be made out to either name.

The seven Omaha-area Episcopal churches represented on the Fricke Episcopal Food Ministry board of directors are All Saints at 93rd and Blondo, Church of the Resurrection at 30th and Belvedere, St. Andrew's at 84th and Pacific, St. Augustine of Canterbury at 208th and Rawhide Road in Elkhorn, St. Martha's at 84th and Pinnacle Drive in Papillion, St. Martin of Tours at 24th and J in South Omaha, and Trinity Cathedral at 18th and Capitol.
