REFLECTIONS FROM THE PEW BY DAN SITZMAN

Although birds' eggs are generally a similar shape, there is a wide variation to which they are symmetrical, round, or bottom-heavy. For many years, scientists have sought to determine if life history, nesting habits, or some other advantage favors these characteristics for each bird species. Over the past decade, a group of researchers from Princeton, Harvard, Singapore, Australia, the United Kingdom, and Israel collaborated to look at nearly 50,000 eggs from more than 1400 species, considering morphological, biophysical, and evolutionary differences. Their results, published last summer in the journal, *Science*, suggest adaptations that assist a species' flying patterns are most likely to be responsible for the variations in egg shape. There are still many angles to investigate, but new insights have led to a better understanding of phenomena that at times we may find to be routine, common or insignificant to our current situation.

As we celebrate Easter, the symbolism of birds' eggs connecting to the idea of transformation are all around us: the emergence of new life from behind a shell; the promise of Northern Hemisphere spring after a long, cold winter; the enthusiasm of our church youth scouring the landscape for an unseen reward hidden in a plastic egg. No matter how many times we have celebrated this most significant of Christian holidays, no matter how routine or common this time of year may seem, there are still new insights we can gain, especially in collaboration with others, whether in the next pew or from around the world.

Jesus Christ has risen today! Alleluia!
